The finished size of the table runner is 19" x 64". The design floats on the background fabric. There is no border added, but if you'd like to add a 6" (cut $6\frac{1}{2}$ ") wide border, the runner would measure 31" x 76" and make a lovely bed runner for the foot of a bed.

When selecting fabrics for this mystery quilt, be aware that you will see a lot of your light background fabric. Do not use a directional fabric for the light background.

In addition to the background fabric, you need four more fabrics that contrast with the background and each other. Use color and/or value to achieve that contrast.

Fabric Requirements

Light Background	2 yards
Accent #1	fat quarter
Accent #2	fat quarter
Accent #3	fat quarter
Accent #4	fat quarter
Optional Border for Bed Runner	1 yard
Backing Backing for Table Runner Backing for Bed Runner	2 yards 2¾ yards
Binding Binding for Table Runner Binding for Bed Runner	½ yard % yard

Other Supplies

Seam ripper, pins... and other basic supplies

Rotary cutter, mat, & rulers

- Rotary cutter 45mm or 60 mm
- 12" x 18" mat is the recommended size for class An 18" x 24" or larger would be easier to use when cutting the fat quarters at home.
- Ruler 6" x 12" or a medium square ruler (8½" or 9½" square) is the recommended size for class

Cut fabrics as directed on page 2 prior to class. Bring the supplies, tools, precut pieces, and excess fabric to class. You may leave the optional border, backing, and binding fabrics at home.

Cutting Instructions for Guess Who's Coming to Dinner XXVII

Light Background

Strips are cut across the width of the fabric, making them approximately 40" long with selvages on each of the short ends.

Cut two strips 5¾" wide.

Use the strips to cut eight 5%" squares.

Cut one strip 4½" wide.

Use the strip to cut sixteen 1½" x 4½" rectangles.

Cut one strip 3½" wide.

Use the strip to cut sixteen 1½" x 3½" rectangles.

Cut one strip 2½" wide.

Use the strip to cut sixteen 2½" squares.

Cut one strip 1½" wide.

Use the strip to cut twenty 1½" squares.

Accent Fabrics #1 - #4

All of the accent fabrics are cut exactly the same. You can cut all four at once to save time. Open the fat quarters to a single layer. Stack them with the selvages on top of each other.

Begin by cutting off the selvages of the stack of fat quarters. Refer to the illustration at the right and cut the following pieces from each fat quarter.

Strips are cut parallel to the edge where the selvages were removed.

Cut one strip 5¾" wide.

Use the strip to cut two 5¾" squares.

Cut four strips 1½" wide.

From each strip, cut one 1%" x 6%" rectangle, one 1%" x 3%" rectangle, two 1%" x 2%" rectangles, and one 1%" square.

When you have finished cutting the fat quarters you will have cut the following from each of the fat quarters:

- two 5¾" squares,
- four 1½" x 6½" rectangles,
- four 1½" x 3½" rectangles,
- eight 1½" x 2½" rectangles, and
- four 1½" squares.
